Glimpse into our LC




Over the past few weeks, learners from various grades have been "testing out" of subjects with a 100% score — earning their pass to explore the Learning Centre. Once here, they've embraced the freedom to learn with purpose and passion.

Spotlight Project



Grade 6 learner Archi Vaishnav stepped into the Learning Centre with a personal goal—to develop her speaking and presentation skills. What followed was a thoughtful, independent project that celebrated India's recent space achievement while uplifting young voices.

Archi scripted and led a morning meeting session across all Grade 6 classes, centering her presentation on astronaut Shubhanshu Shukla's historic Axiom-4 mission. She combined AI prompt engineering with research skills, studying archival footage of Rakesh Sharma's iconic 1984 space conversation with then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi.

Her session featured:

- Powerful scripting and live delivery
- Curated video clips from both historic and current moments
- An interactive reflection activity, where students wrote their dreams on star cutouts—now proudly displayed in classrooms
- Feedback collection through a self-designed rubric, helping her reflect and set new goals

Archi's project beautifully reflects the spirit of the Learning Centre—student-led, purpose-driven, and deeply inspiring.

Grades 6–12 learners were introduced to Voice It Out!, a year-long workshop focused on:

- Podcast creation
- Voiceovers & announcements
- Public speaking & storytelling
- Audio editing & scriptwriting

- Grades 8–12: Digital Marketing, Media Literacy and Print Media & Journalism




Voices from the Centre



If the bulb is off but warm, then Switch 1 controls the bulb is off but warm, then Switch 2 controls the bulb (it was recently on).


If the bulb is off and cold, then Switch 3 controls the bulb (it was never turned on).

This way, you can identify the correct switch with just one check of the bulb.




